Some projects are visions that take years to come to fruition while others are simply spur of the moment inspirations. Careful planning, budgets and design meetings may be involved.

Fortunately for the shelter our new floor started with an adopter concerned about long term wear on the kennel floors.

When Dan Poggioli of Pecatonica decided to adopt a new dog, he looked at several shelters in the area. It was at Friends Forever Humane Society (FFHS) in Freeport that he found the dog he was looking for — a Labrador named Josie.

While Poggioli was walking through the dog kennel area, he noticed some warped flooring, a result of flooding in both 2010 and 2011. He mentioned to Carol Falconer, shelter manager, that the shelter would run into problems if the flooring was not fixed. Falconer replied that she and the board were aware of the situation, but lacked the funds to fix the floor.

This is where Poggioli sprang into action. By trade, this man is owner and operator of his own flooring business — Poggioli Custom Flooring, Inc. He told Falconer he would do the job for free, donating the materials himself.

"We knew the flooring was getting bad, but we just didn't have the money to do anything about it," Falconer said. "The floor began to curl and buckle from water damage and lack of maintenance.

"I thought it was wonderful when he offered to help — you can't turn down an offer like this," she added.

Kindness of Others

Friends Forever Humane Society began making changes in the entrance to the shelter this past year. They opened up a conference room to make the entrance more welcoming to people stopping in at the shelter. They began to slowly turn the only counter area into a retail shop. They ripped up old flooring with hopes to make changes. When Poggioli saw the entrance needed new tile, he stepped in to help here, too.

Using colored tile, Poggioli cut in letters to spell out Friends Forever. This greets people as they walk into the main entrance. All the flooring was finished this past weekend. Falconer is all smiles these days.

At the end of the morning, only a handful of cookies and about 48 gift baskets remained. At the suggestion of one of our volunteers, Luecke Jewelers in Freeport was contacted about displaying the remaining baskets during the downtown holiday walk. Luecke's graciously agreed to display

the baskets on Sunday, November 20th.

As the store opened for the downtown walk, baskets became a hit. 32 of the remaining baskets were sold that afternoon.



Have you ever thought about.... By Carol Falconer, Mgr.



Have you ever thought about the difference between a "free" dog or cat and a shelter animal?

On average, after acquiring your "free" pet, it will not be free for long.

FFHS makes sure all the animals it adopts out are current with vaccinations, micro chipped, spayed or neutered, and dewormed. Flea treatment, nail trimming, ear cleaning and disease testing are also done. All these services are included in the adoption fees of \$85.00 for cats and \$120.00 for dogs.

In order to have these services provided by a veterinarian for a "free" dog or cat, the costs would average approximately \$225.00 for cats and \$365.00 for dogs.

So the next time someone talks about a "free" dog or cat, remember- there is no such thing as a "free" pet.

Poggioli is humble about his volunteer efforts at this local shelter. He said he was aware of the need for volunteer help to make repairs at Friends Forever. When he saw trouble areas in the kennel, he said he knew he could help out.

"It's really not a big deal what I did, but the flooring was in bad need of repair in the kennel area," Poggioli said, "As far as the entrance tile - I had some rubber tile the same color as their logo and it just made sense to create the name in the floor - it just feels good to help out.

"What I did in the kennel area is just help them save their floor, because if not, it would have cost them a lot more money down the road," he added.

where appropriate. We hope to re-activate our volunteers in the new year.

Because of some of the responsibilities associated with certain volunteer positions, not everyone may be able to volunteer in certain areas. In those situations, a volunteer interview will be conducted. If, after the interview, the volunteer candidate is deemed capable of doing the tasks associated with that particular area, an orientation and training will be provided.

ALL of our volunteers are important at FFHS. If the area of interest does not turn out to be well suited for a particular applicant, we will do our best to help find an area that matches the applicant's skills.

If you have completed a volunteer application in the last 3 months and have not been contacted, please call the office and let us know. If you are interested in volunteering, stop by the shelter or the FFHS website and fill out an application.
